November 2022: \$4 billion inflows highest since March

- Canadian ETFs gathered \$4.2 billion in November, bringing YTD inflows to \$28 billion
- Cash Alternative ETFs continued its haul, pulling in another \$1 billion; aggregate bonds back in favour
- Equity ETFs also enjoyed inflows across all regions, though meagre compared with fixed income flows
- 15 new ETFs launched in November

Summary: Canadian ETFs had a strong month of \$4.2 billion in net flows in November, with Fixed Income ETFs once again dominating new creations. Equity ETFs saw inflows of \$1.6 billion; Canadian equities lead the inflows, accumulating \$745 million while the U.S. and International regions gathered over \$400 million each.

Fixed Income ETFs enjoyed another gangbuster month of inflows at \$2.3 billion in creations, led by Canadian aggregate bond ETFs and cash alternative ETFs. Ultra short-term ETFs lost \$1.1 billion while broad maturity products gained \$2.1 billion, reflecting investor preference for longer-duration fixed income ETFs as the yield curve goes into deep inversion in both Canada and the U.S.

Crypto-Asset ETFs had minor outflows of \$29 million in November. However, as the underlying crypto-assets plummet in value, the AUM of Crypto-Asset ETFs dropped to \$1.8 billion as of November (Chart 2). At its peak, the AUM of this category reached \$7.5 billion in November 2021. Chart 2 shows that despite this (perhaps typical) drawdown in bitcoin and Ethereum prices, users of Canadian crypto-ETFs have yet to dispose of shares *en masse*. In past drawdowns (e.g., May 2021), we saw the *pace* of inflows slow down rather than turn negative (grey area in Chart 2), but only recently flattened to a small trickle of outflows. This suggests that crypto-asset ETF users are sticking to their allocations, possibly hoping for the market to recoup these losses in the long term.

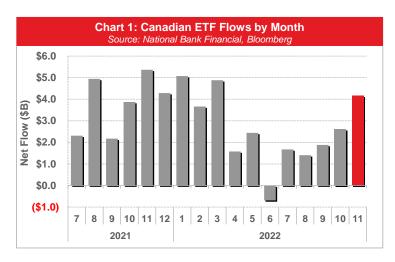

Equity ETFs took in \$1.6 billion in November. In addition to broad market ETFs, particularly for the Canada region (XIC, XIU, HXT, VCN) and the U.S. (XSP, VSP), low volatility ETFs (ZLU) also started to finally pull in assets in November, perhaps based off their defensive profile and outperformance year-to-date.

Financial sector ETFs (e.g., **ZEB**, BMO Equal Weight Canadian Bank) suffered withdrawals of \$166 million, but all other sectors led by Real Estate and Materials registered inflows.

Fixed Income ETFs continue to rake in dollars. November was the Canadian universe bond index's second-best month in returns (after July) in what was a punishing calendar year for the asset class. Cash alternative ETFs welcomed another \$1.2 billion, bringing the category's AUM to more than \$13 billion, more than double the level of where its assets stood at the end of last year. Three "high interest savings" ETFs from different providers (CSAV, PSA, CASH) appear on the top inflow leaderboard for November. Contrary to the previous month when ultra shortterm ETFs were in favour, in November, the category lost \$1.1 billion from ETFs such as ZST and ZMMK. On the other end of the maturity spectrum, ETFs with longer duration experienced a renewal in demand. Aggregate bond ETFs (VAB, HBB, ZAG, XBB) and longterm bond ETFs (ZTL/F) attracted new money as longer-term rates fell in tandem with slowing inflation, coupled with a growing expectation that there would be smaller rate hikes ahead by the Fed.

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In terms of flows, not a lot of activity is happening in the crypto-asset or commodity ETF space. Commodities ETFs held steady with more than \$1 billion in AUM while Crypto-Asset ETFs fell to \$1.8 billion in AUM as discussed above. The \$85 million inflows into Commodity ETFs mostly went into the newly launched CI Broad Commodity Index ETF (CCOM) and gold ETFs.

Flows by Provider and New Launches (Tables 2 - 3):

The majority of ETF issuers enjoyed inflows while BMO, Manulife, Dynamic and Desjardins were the few that suffered some outflows.

15 new ETFs launched in November, a busy month; new ETFs fall in the categories of thematic equity, factor-based equity, fixed income and option strategies.

Canadian ESG ETF Flows (Table 4): Inflows to ESG ETFs continued in November. ESG ETFs had net inflows of \$105 million, mostly contributed by institutional-sized creations in NBI Sustainable Canadian Equity ETF (NSCE). This product is now the second largest ESG ETF in Canada (behind BMO's ESGY) having pulled in over \$995 million this year and reaching \$1.4 billion in AUM at the end of November (our October ETF flow report described its methodology.) Absent inflows into NSCE, ESG Equity ETFs as a group would have suffered outflows in November.

Note: the tables below all use the "new" flows calculation methodology.

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YTD November 2022 Flow (Tables 13 - 21):

Canadian ETFs managed to receive net inflows of \$28 billion in 2022 year-to-date. With \$13 billion created in fixed income in 2022 so far, it is the first year for Fixed Income ETFs to lead Equities in net inflows since 2019. Despite the fact that inflation fears have been dominating conversations and headlines, Commodity ETFs in Canada had small *outflows* of \$286 million year-to-date, primarily from gold ETFs.

Multi-Asset ETFs welcomed \$1.9 billion in flows, with steady contributions from investors every month. Investors are increasingly adopting alternative strategies that invest in multiple asset classes, a trend that has been reflected in the flows. Market neutral ETFs such as **DANC** were used tactically during this volatile year. Crypto-asset ETF flows are almost flat on the year with \$66 million redeemed on a net basis.

Within equity ETFs, Canada and the U.S. equally split the inflows with \$3.9 billion towards each, while ETFs focusing on "global equity" contributed \$2.5 billion in net inflows. Low volatility ETFs and multi-factor ETFs saw redemptions. The multi-factor ETF outflows were driven mostly by redemptions from CIBC's multi-factor ETF suite.

In a year with rapidly rising interest rates and widening credit spreads, cash alternative ETFs have claimed the crown for fixed income ETF demand. Cash alternative ETFs gathered \$7 billion, or \$2 billion more than the inflows accumulated by Canadian aggregate bond ETFs in the same year-to-date period. Categories with higher credit exposure such as sub-investment grade bonds and preferred share suffered outflows.

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Appendix 1 - Glossary

AUM (Assets Under Management): AUM is expressed in local currency, which is the Canadian dollar for the purpose of this report.

Flow/AUM (Flow as % AUM): Net flow as a percentage of assets under management from the beginning of the period.

Flow: The net dollar amount of fund creations and redemptions for the period based on daily NAV and daily changes in Shares Outstanding. Flows are expressed in local currency, which is the Canadian dollar for the purpose of this report.

Market Share (%): Category's AUM as % of the total AUM.

MER (Management Expense Ratio): Manager's 2021 annual fee for managing and administering the fund, expressed as a percentage of total fund value. In most cases this includes fees from investing in other ETFs. Where audited MER is unavailable or if the fee has been significantly reduced recently, the MER is estimated using the Stated Management Fee and sales tax.

Canadian MER does not include trading commissions incurred by the ETF, nor does it include trading expenses (such as swap or forward fees). An asterisk (*) indicates that the fund pays additional expenses such as swap or forward fees, which are normally reported under trading expenses. The asterisk can also indicate that the fund charges a performance fee. Data are sourced from annual fillings.

NAV (Net Asset Value per share): ETF price is used when NAV is not available.

All numbers are as of last month's final business day.

Appendix 2 - Equity ETF Categories

We group Equity ETFs into the categories below. These groupings follow NBF's discretion and can differ from the ETF Provider's definition and classification from other sources.

Cap-Weighted: A fund that weights securities based on the total or float-adjusted market capitalization of each security.

Dividend/Income: A fund with primary goal of providing income. We classify a fund as belonging to the Income category when its strategy focuses on providing income, or the fund self-identifies as using an income strategy even though it may incorporate other factors in addition to income.

Fundamental: A fund that selects and/or weights securities based on fundamental metrics from a company's financial statements such as balance sheet. Strategies include Value, Growth, Quality, RAFI Fundamental, Earnings, etc.

Low Vol or Risk: A fund that aims to achieve reduced portfolio volatility, either by screening for low volatility stocks, low beta stocks and/or minimizing the portfolio volatility.

Multi-Factor: ETFs that consider more than one NBF-defined factor including Income, Fundamental and Risk.

Sector: ETFs that provide exposure to broad industry sectors classified by the Global Industry Classification Standard (GICS) or other similar classifications. This category contains all sector funds, including ones that screen and/or weight the portfolio using factors.

Thematic: ETFs that provide niche exposures such as blockchain technology, infrastructure, Marijuana companies, Socially Responsible Investing, technology sub-sectors, agriculture, water, sentiment & behaviour, etc. This category contains all thematic funds, including ones that screen and/or weight the portfolio using factors.

Other: Any non-cap weighted strategy that is not covered by otherwise defined categories. This includes momentum, equalweight, share buyback, high beta, proprietary, actively managed, tactical rotation, price-weighted, etc.



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
